





Titles include: Now For Reality [with poems by Aleister Crowley]; The Book of Ugly Ecstasy; The Focus of Life: The mutterings of Aaos; Automatic Drawing; Images & Oracles of Austin Osman Spare [Kenneth Grant]; Austin Spare: An introduction to his life & writings [Sunny Shah]; and two scarce exhibition catalogues, Austin Osman Spare. Also included are eight publications by I-H-O Books, seemingly an imprint of Mandrake Press, the publishing house associated with Aleister Crowley and the occult in the 1930s. 



AUTOGRAPH BOOK OF AUSTRALIAN AVIATORS

1930–1942. Hardcover autograph book, cloth-bound, autograph collector's details in ink on inside front cover, 42 autographs in ink in various hands, 10 x 16.2 x 1cm. Chips, tears and paper remnants to endpapers, slight foxing, binding slightly loose, minor wear to cover.

Annotation reads "Clarice Hollowood, Molton [105 Emu Street], Longreach. [Qld]." The book contains inscriptions and autographs by record-breaking aviators, Qantas pilots, a Governor of Queensland, and members of the armed forces, from Australia, the UK and USA. Australian and international notables include: Hudson Fysh (Aust., 1895–1974) one of the founders of Qantas, Cecil Arthur Butler (Aust., 1902–1980) who completed a record flight from England to Australia in 1931; Russell B. Tapp (1898–1984), a Qantas pilot, who was the first aviator in Australia to transport mail on the Imperial Service to Darwin; Charles W.A. Scott (Brit., 1903–1946) who made a record time from England to Australia in 1931 and was also winner of the MacRobertson Air Race (London to Melbourne) in 1934; five crew members of the aircraft *Astrea*, which made the inaugural flight from the UK to Australia in 1933, opening up commercial air travel between the two countries; and Governor of Queensland John Goodwin (Brit., 1871-1960) who was in office from 13 July 1927 to 7 April 1932, and his wife Lilian. Group of twelve items comprising two pencil sketches, two items of correspondence, three colour process lithograph exhibition catalogues and one greeting card from the National Gallery of Victoria, one photocopied price list, two slips of newsprint, and one hardcover book with slipcover, The Art Of Justin O'Brien, editioned 140/250 and signed in ink by author Anthony Bradley and O'Brien, sizes from 9.1 x 16.3cm to 38.5 x 29.5cm. Stains and creases to sketches and correspondence, slight soiling and wear to most items, book and slipcase in very good condition.

The correspondence, which is addressed to Laurie Lane of Bondi Beach, sent by O'Brien (1917-1996) from Rome, comprises an aerogramme postmarked 1983, regarding O'Brien's pension claim, and a letter postmarked 1995 which includes reference to his prostate cancer. 

1979–1992. Nineteen (19) items comprising of 12 ink illustrations and seven letters including examples of book cover art, each illustration captioned, and each letter signed by Leunig in ink, some letters or envelopes stamped "received" with date, 4 x 6cm (illustrations approx. each). Most images taped to paper, some with stains; wear to correspondence.

Eleven out of 12 illustrations appear in Leunig's 1992 book, *A Bunch of Poesy*, alongside three letters to Tom Thompson of Collins, and Angus & Robertson publishing houses, one which has six examples of cover designs in ink drawn by Leunig for the book. There are also three letters to "Richard" (likely of Angus & Robertson) concerning publishing instructions on the colour of *The Bedtime Leunig* (1981): "must be in strong red." Also included is a mock-up cover in ink for *The Second Leunig: A dusty little swag* (1979), and a letter to "Roz" with the inked letters for the cover of *A Bag of Roosters* (1983).



WINGED DRAGON, FINE ILLUMINATIONS IN AN EARLY BOOK OF HOURS LEAF C.1390.

For most God-fearing medieval people, the dragon was a real creature: a reptilian, winged, fire-breathing creature aligned with Satan, the bearer of death and misfortune and, significantly, the evil of paganism. The dragon depicted on this Book of Hours leaf may well have been included in the illuminations as a reminder to the devout reader of the evils associated with the creature and to direct him or her to the safety and truth of the holy text where salvation was to be found.

Latin text in a gothic bookhand written on vellum. Extensive, high quality illuminations including a beautifully depicted flying dragon with red, white and blue wings, clawed feet, a gaping mouth and a spiked spine in burnished gold.

Very good condition, particularly for its age. The edges of the vellum have darkened over the centuries and there are a few very small spots. However the colours of the illuminations remain strong and the high quality gilding shines brightly. Size: 185x125 mm.

"THE FIRST STEAM TRAIN IN JAPAN". 1872 COLOUR WOODBLOCK PRINT BY KUNITERU II.

This 2-4-0 tank engine was the one that started the railway age in Japan. It was one of a group of ten locomotives built by various manufacturers in Great Britain to work Japan's first railway opened between *Shimbashi* (Tokyo) and *Yokohama* in 1871. It was built by the Vulcan Foundry of Newton-le-Willows, Lancashire, and still survives today in the Japanese railway museum. This woodblock print portrays it as it appeared when it first ran. Japanese artists, including Hiroshige, were fascinated by the technological marvel of steam propulsion and Kuniteru II produced several woodblock prints of this momentous event in Japan's history.

Fair/good condition. The paper has darkened over the years, there are small tears and holes in the margins and slight creases. Nevertheless, it is a good impression with strong colours. Kuniteru's signature is in the left margin under the round censor seal. Size: 370x250 mm.

MANUSCRIPT PARISIAN "POCKET BIBLE" LEAF, C.1250.

Latin text in gothic *minuscule* script written on fine vellum. The text is from The Book of Jeremiah and includes a scribal correction in the right margin of Recto.

The production of small format bibles flourished in Paris in the 13th century. They were known as "pocket Bibles" because they could be carried in the folds of the habits of itinerant friars. The parent book of this leaf was a high quality bible of the Crusades period, used for preaching of the Gospel around the medieval countryside or in the study of theology. It may have been first owned by a Dominican priest from an academic milieu, as wealthy Flemish Dominicans studied at the Parisian college of Saint-Jacques.

Excellent condition. The script shows no ink loss and the vellum remains clean and unblemished. Vibrant colours. The bottom margin has been slightly trimmed, perhaps for a later re-binding. Size: 165x130 mm.

LOT OF 5 INCUNABLE & POST-INCUNABLE LEAVES. 15th, 16th, 17th & 18th century, that include a watermark, a historiated woodcut initial, two botanical woodcuts, a variety of typefaces and a leaf from Shakespeare's favourite source.

1498 incunable leaf in Latin from St. Jerome's biblical commentaries. Content of this leaf: *Super parabolas Salomonis* (On the parables of Solomon). Printed in Venice. Excellent condition.

1554 post incunable leaf with two woodcuts from the first Latin edition of Pietro Mattioli's botanical treatise on Dioscorides. Text in Greek and Latin. Printed in Venice by Valgrisi. Very good/excellent condition.

1577 leaf from "Holinshed's Chronicle" - Shakespeare's favourite history source for many of his plays. This leaf mentions Macbeth, Fleance and James IV. Text is in English in a blackletter typeface. Fair condition only. Marginal notes trimmed, body of text complete.

1626 Missal leaf printed in Antwerp. A 5-line historiated initial 'O' depicts the martyring of Saint Bernadi. Excellent condition.

1711 Missal leaf with an elaborate watermark. Printed in Antwerp. Liturgical chant with square and diamond shaped neumes on 4-line staves. Excellent condition.

PARISIAN BOOK OF HOURS ILLUMINATED LEAF C.1465

Panels of delicate *rinceaux* illuminations on both sides. The illuminated panels feature acanthus leaves in blue and liquid gold outlined in red & orange, along with swirling tendrils bearing coloured flowers, foliage and gold bezants. The leaf also includes seven one-line illuminated initials.

The text is a section of Psalm 137 (KJV 138) and is followed by two antiphons and the beginning of The Song of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Very good/excellent condition. A fine example of Northern French illumination in the mid -15th century. Size: 170x130 mm.

An incunable leaf with a woodcut by Dürer titled "*Of Bad Women*". Printed by de Olpe in Basel on laid paper with a clear watermark of a hand.

This English translation of Brant's text is by Professor Edwin Zeydel who uses verse form, like the original. A section of his text on 'Of Bad Women' reads:

In shrewdness women lead the van, Not matched are they by any man. His words she never will obey, She heeds not what he'd teach or say, For man misfortune's often sprung From woman's loose and babbling tongue.

The Ship of Fools shows an imagination, wit, and humour rich with insights into human nature. Its commentaries on the boasting, pedantry, false learning, gambling, gluttony, medical folly, adultery, greed, envy, hatred, pride and other failings that mark humanity are sharp and telling, and sadly, as relevant today as they were over 500 years ago.

A REMBRANDT FOR \$150? "THE GOLDSMITH". HÉLIOGRAVURE, 1870.

A beautiful *héliogravure* (photogravure) by Charles Blanc of Rembrandt's 1665 original etching & drypoint. It was published in *L'Oeuvre de Rembrandt* by Charles Blanc in Paris, c. 1870. Blanc was a former French minister of Fine Arts.

The publication contained all the known works and was published in three volumes in a limited edition of 500. This print is no. 60 in the first volume. The héliogravures were produced on fine Dutch laid paper or Japan paper.

A BOOK FOR THE ILLITERATE TO "READ". 1524 WOODBLOCK PRINT FROM A "PICTURE ROSARY".

A leaf titled "The Arrival in Egypt" from from the *Rosario de la Gloriosa Virgine* Maria by Alberto da Castello. - a block-printed Rosary book.

In the still predominantly oral culture of the late 15th century the visual media of the day - block prints, painted or carved altarpieces and devotional panels - played an essential role in the dissemination of religious teachings. At the beginning of the Renaissance, European males had a literacy rate of about 5 to 10 percent, while female literacy was about 1 percent, although these figures varied based on social class and location. To those unable to read well - or unable to read at all - the printed rosary book served as a device for prayer and meditation. Picture rosaries had the unique advantage of being able to be "read" in any language and by users who were not literate in Latin or even in the vernacular.

LARGE & FINELY ILLUMINATED MISSAL LEAF IN THE STYLE OF A BOOK OF HOURS. C.1425.

Written & illuminated on vellum in Spain or Southern France in the early part of the 15th century. The illuminations include a splendid two-line initial 'S' in blue outlined in black with white penwork on a burnished gold ground, infilled with a foliate design. Beside the initial is a six-line marginal panel of coloured acanthus leaves, flowers and leaves in the style of a Book of Hours. Three two-line initials in burnished gold on red and blue grounds highlighted with white penwork and alternating red and blue one-line initials.

Further illuminations on Verso. Size: c.375x275 mm.


The initial 'S' beside the illuminated panel begins the mass for the Feast of St. Stephen. Condition: The Recto of this leaf is in very good condition. The parchment has some slight cockling, and there are a few minor green stains in the bottom corner, but otherwise the high quality calligraphy has no ink loss, the colours remain bright and the burnished gold shines brightly. There is a small repaired edge tear in the right margin, not visible within the mat window. Verso has had a harder life, but is still highly presentable.

First edition of this famous Pacific rarity and one of the centrepieces of a Pacific voyage collection: Broughton's account of his lengthy Pacific voyage is filled with descriptions of the Northwest Coast, Hawaii and New South Wales. It is a difficult book to find: the Kroepelien collection, for example, had only the German and French versions of the work while Lada-Mocarski describes it as 'Extremely rare... the information contained in it is of prime importance'.





The superb engravings can be seen to their best advantage in this folio format where they do not have to be folded as is usual. The images are mostly the work of William Hodges whose presence on the voyage resulted also in a superb series of oil-paintings.



The very rare and valuable first English edition of this remarkable imaginary voyage, in which Jacques Sadeur makes his way to the southern land and discovers in western Australia an idealised society of large-bodied hermaphrodites who live in harmony with one another. This English language printing of 1693 contains the very first usage of the words 'Australia' and 'Australian' in print. Ordinarily Matthew Flinders is credited as having been the first published author of the name 'Australia', as it appears in his *Voyage to Terra Australis*. However, Foigny's fantastic story predates this by more than a century. First published in French in Switzerland in 1676 (where it was promptly banned by church authorities), the book was republished in several locations. This important first edition in English of 1693 is notably rare.



Lisiansky's narrative is a counterpart to Krusenstern's own account of the voyage: after the expedition reached Hawaii in 1804 the expedition's two ships separated and Lisiansky went to Kodiak aboard the *Neva*, where he corroborated reports that Indians had demolished the settlement at Sitka. Lisiansky's orders were different to those given to Krusenstern and so he alone called at Easter Island and remained longer in Hawaii, where he discovered the island that now bears his name.





and a dazzling intellectual passion, it is both a seminal work of modern geology and a compelling precursor to Darwinism, speculating on radical changes in climate and geography across the ages, and exploring the evidence for the progressive development of life" (Secord).



A superb Sydney Harbour scene, sweeping from Elizabeth Bay House in the middle-ground around to the lower north shore, showcasing Martens's remarkable talent at capturing the shimmering waters and the intense light of the city. Martens has chosen his viewpoint, the ridge at Darling Point looking back across Elizabeth Bay towards the city, with great care, giving full rein to his skill as a landscape artist while also allowing him to devote his typical care to the foliage in the foreground: his informal scientific training meant that he was one of the few colonial artists to really master the distinctive look of the Australian Bush, and he took unusual care to be botanically accurate. More, in the present picture he has purposefully set out to minimise the built landscape by positioning the central tree in just such a way as to mask most of the city apart from the imposing Stables for Government House (now the Conservatorium of Music).



This work, profusely illustrated and with many valuable historical documents appended to the main narrative, is of great importance in the study of early trading in furs originating on the Northwest coast and of a serious conflict between the English and the Spaniards in this connection...' 





Tench's first work on the colony at Port Jackson, in the important third edition, the first to include his new *Postscript*, printing a letter from Sydney Cove dated 1 October 1788. This closely-printed letter (pp. 147-8) reports further activity since July and, despite the growing difficulties faced by the settlers, strikes the bright and optimistic note characteristic of the author. The letter is particularly interesting regarding the early settlement at Norfolk Island and includes the ominous aside that the Norfolk settlers have made every attempt to 'find a landing-place, whence it might be practicable to ship off the timber growing there, but hitherto none has been discovered.' Just six months after the time of writing the *Sirius* would be wrecked trying to anchor there.



Trivia was published on January 26, 1716, in an ordinary edition priced at one and sixpence, and 250 large paper copies subscribed for by friends and patrons of the poet and priced at a guinea. Gay's satirical verse was modelled on Virgil's Georgics, transported to the streets of Hanoverian London. (The title is from the Latin 'trivium', meaning 'crossroads'). The poem contains descriptions of London and includes advice to 'prudent walkers' warning 'those who are unacquainted with the town' against dangers such as pickpockets, whores and runaway carts.









This story which remains very popular in Thailand to this day, tells the story of a monk who having gain great merit, travels to heaven and hell and then returns to earth to tell the people what he saw there. During the 19th century with the spread of printing these beautiful manuscripts were increasing surplanted by printed editions of the story and by the beginning of the 20th century printed editions of this work had become the norm. 



Chinese and non-Chinese contributors are intermingled through the text.




